## IMPACT REFLECTION

- Confidence: children had the freedom, time and space to learn and demonstrate independence
  - Social skills: children gained increased awareness of the consequences of their actions on peers through team activities such as sharing tools and participating in play
  - Communication: language development was prompted by the children's sensory experiences
- Motivation: the forest school site tended to fascinate the children and they developed a keenness to participate and the ability to focus for longer periods of time
- Physical skills: the development of physical stamina and gross and fine motor skills
- Knowledge and understanding: the children developed an interest in the natural surroundings and respect for the environment. There is a personal reward for us as leaders — to see the children grow in confidence and be able to achieve new skills and develop their understanding of nature.
